## Things to Expect When Visiting a Pantry

- 1. You May need to wait in line. Often our neighbors start lining up before the pantry opens.
- 2. Bring your own bags, boxes, portable carts etc. to carry your groceries home/out to your vehicle.
- 3. Depending on the pantry you visit, items may be preboxed.
- 4. It is OK to talk with pantry volunteers/staff about any dietary needs that need to be met
  - a. I have to follow a diabetic friendly diet
  - b. I have a specific food allergy/allergies
  - c. I have to follow a gluten free diet.
- 5. You will be asked for a name and number in your household.
  - a. There may be a TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program) form for you to sign. This information is CONFIDENTIAL. It is stored with the pantry securely. It is NOT given to HACAP and is NOT used to coordinate with any government or law enforcement services. You are safe.
- 6. It is OK to have someone pick up for you as proxy.
